Meeting opened by Sarah Grant Joriman at 7pm.

Present: Members in Person: Guests: Members on Zoom:

President: In honor of Veteran's Day, Sarah recognized the service of all veterans.

VP: Penny asked that several members please volunteer to stay at the end of the evening to help with the take down of heavy display tables. Penny announced the December meeting plans and encouraged guild members to bring an item for the silent auction (Handmade item, fibers, books) which will raise money to benefit the guild. It was decided to make the meeting a pot luck with members bringing dish to pass, beverage, and their own table setting. It will begin at 6:30pm. Nancy Reile announced that for the silent auction, she will be bringing a donation of yarns from past guild member Betty Appeldoorn.

Secretary: Bev thanked Ann Niemi for taking minutes at the October meeting. Susan moved to approve the October 14, 2024 meeting minutes, seconded by Paula Dunlap. Motion passed. Bev introduced Dan Martin, Laurie Martin's husband, who has offered to be the webmaster this year. **Treasurer:** Shari reported we now have 86 members. Shari reviewed the October financials. Bev Zalewski moved to approve the October statement, seconded by Kati Meek. Motion passed.

Education: Karen VanderWeele reported there currently aren't any demonstrations coming up. The following information was shared about each Study Group:

Spinners on Wheels Karen reported they will meet at the Parkview Hills Clubhouse on Wednesday, November 20 from 10-2, bring a lunch. They are currently studying flax spinning.

Spin2Weave information is in the Shuttle, contact Terri Feldt if interested.

4 Harness Judith Jones reports they meet on the second Thursday of the month at 9am at the Parkview Hills Clubhouse and on Zoom. This year they are focusing on rag weaving.

Little Looms Shari Glaser reports they choose flexible dates and times in person and on Zoom. They are focusing on recycling and repurposing.

Warped Women (Beginners) Susan Boyce reports they will meet on November 18 and are working on kitchen towels.

Multi Harness Nancy Reile reported they will meet on Zoom at 1pm Wednesday, November 20.

MLH: Nancy Reile reported that the MLH annual conference and workshops will be held June 5-8, 2025 at the Ralph MacMullen Conference Center in Higgins Lake. The registration begins January 15, 2025 see the MLH website for the booklet. Also Cally Booker and Janet Phillips will be presenting Zoom workshops in early 2025.

Show and Tell:

Karen VanderWeele showed a knit long stocking for the reenactment festivals she attends. Bev Zalewski showed two boundweave rugs from an October Sievers class on Washington Island, Wisconsin. She and her husband took the class taught by Lynn Stracka Schuster. Lou Morgan showed an innovative pillow and a handsome tote bag woven from rags. Lou comes from a family of rag rug weavers. Uta Turcotte showed several pieces including a lovely table runner woven in a pinwheel pattern. Sama Cunningham showed a beautiful hand knit Fair Isle scarf. The Business Meeting was closed at 7:35pm. Penny Marsh moved to close, Susan Rice seconded. A short break was taken.

Introduction of Featured speaker (on Zoom): 7:45. Penny introduced fiber artist Martina Celerin of Bloomington, Indiana.

Martina gave us a short biography of her life from Prague in the Czech Republic, to a refugee in SW Ontario, Canada, to a molecular geneticist at IU in Bloomington. She transitioned from Science to Art which was her passion. She weaves on a handmade nail loom which is a wooden frame. Her weaving incorporates objects, textures, shape, and needle felting. Her inspiration comes from nature and the many collected /found objects that she uses including stones, beads, thrums, wood, and recycled fibers. Her wall art is an inventive 3D tapestry.

Bev commented that the September meeting ran long with the featured speaker not finished by 9pm. She wondered if the business meeting could be shortened. Penny thought there is no problem with the length of the business meeting and feels study groups and "show & tell" are important discussions. The board decided that attention will be paid to the length of these discussions to cover reports yet also improve length of meeting.

Penny reported that 5 heavy display tables are difficult to put away at the end of the night. To facilitate clean up she would like volunteers or perhaps each round table could be assigned a clean up task. Penny is planning the December meeting, creating a flyer to encourage members to donate an item for the silent auction. She would like members to vote if the December meeting will be a pot luck. Perhaps Linda Innes could do a screen show of photos she has taken during the year. What time should we plan for starting in December? Should she should present a game she put together?

Penny reported the February meeting will be a variety of little loom demonstrations. Karen would like to demonstrate nalbinding also.

Penny also brought up the issue of nominations for next years board. She felt if she had 2 others helping her with the task it would be manageable.

She is working on program ideas for 2025-26. Penny is asking for recommended topics for the 2025-26 programs. Karen suggested a workshop on weaving double width fabric. Penny is hoping several of our own guild members will be willing to be featured presenters. Discussion took place as to the fact that members have not been paid for a presentation in the past due to our non-profit status. They are allowed reimbursement for supplies they must purchase to demonstrate a program. A dinner prior to the meeting will be offered to all speakers as a courtesy. Penny is looking over the MLH grants.

Shari reported we now have 86 members! Shari did not have the October financials complete as it wasn't the end of the month. She met with our insurance agent and was able to reduce our annual premium from \$500 to \$375. There was an unnecessary clause to cover \$17,000 of equipment at our monthly meeting which she omitted from the policy.

November 26, 2024

Zoom Present: Sarah Grant Joriman, Penny Marsh, Shari Glaser, Bev Zalewski, Ann Niemi, Karen VanderWeele, Karen Lason, Kristi Chapman, Nancy Reile
Meeting called to order at 3 pm

Penny moved to approve the October board minutes, Ann seconded, motion passed. Sarah asked the board to consider switching the December board meeting date as it falls on New Years Eve. Discussion followed and it was decided the board didn't need to meet in December. Our next board meeting will be on Tuesday, January 28, 2025 at 3pm.

Penny reported that the plan for the December general meeting is a potluck from 6:30-7:30 with a slide show running during that time and all items on display for silent bidding. A business meeting including show and tell will begin at 7:30. The bidding will end at 8:30 pm and payments will be collected. Penny said the plans for the January meeting (by Zoom only) will be for each member to give a 3 minute talk about their favorite resource for projects. The resource could be a magazine or book, a yarn, a supplier, a YouTube video, etc. Penny will serve as a moderator for the meeting. She will create a flyer about the January meeting. An email will be sent to members with the flyer and the program Zoom link. The board decided that a January Shuttle isn't necessary.

Penny brought up the idea for an October 2025 program. She suggests we hold a sale on our regular meeting date, with the sale serving as the program. All members will **BRING IN** items they would like to price and sell. It can include weaving or spinning equipment, books, patterns, stash yarns, finished handwoven items. The seller would keep the proceeds. All salable items must be on site (no photos of items at home). Ann pointed out that the meeting is to be only open to members and guests and not to the general public.

Kristi has a number of duplicate library books from the donations she has received from Martha Reeves, Lestra Hazel, and Diana Schneider. She will bring the extra books to our December Silent Auction meeting (the proceeds go to the guild). Each month library books are transported from the library to the meeting. There is a need for a cart to move books to car, from parking lot, to venue. Karen Lason will shop for a cart.

Shari reported on the to-date November financials. Revenue is \$217 including a workshop payment, book sales, and equipment rental fees. Expenses are \$559 including November speaker expense, annual website payment, and Arts Council membership. We had no new members join in November. Shari recommends that Bev take the sign-in sheets home after each meeting to use in the secretary reports.

Bev reported that Dan Martin is the new webmaster and he should be contacted with any information for posting on the website. Daniel.Martin@nhbp-nsn.gov.

The Google account email that Sarah set up will be receiving the messages from "Contacts" on our website. Sarah will keep watch for those. We are now subscribed to Wix as the website host for 12 months, which will save money vs the monthly fees we were paying.

Nancy reported that registration opens on January 15 for MLH June 5-8, 2025 workshops. Also registration for a Zoom Janet Phillips workshop opens December 1.

Ann would like copy for the December Shuttle by December 1.

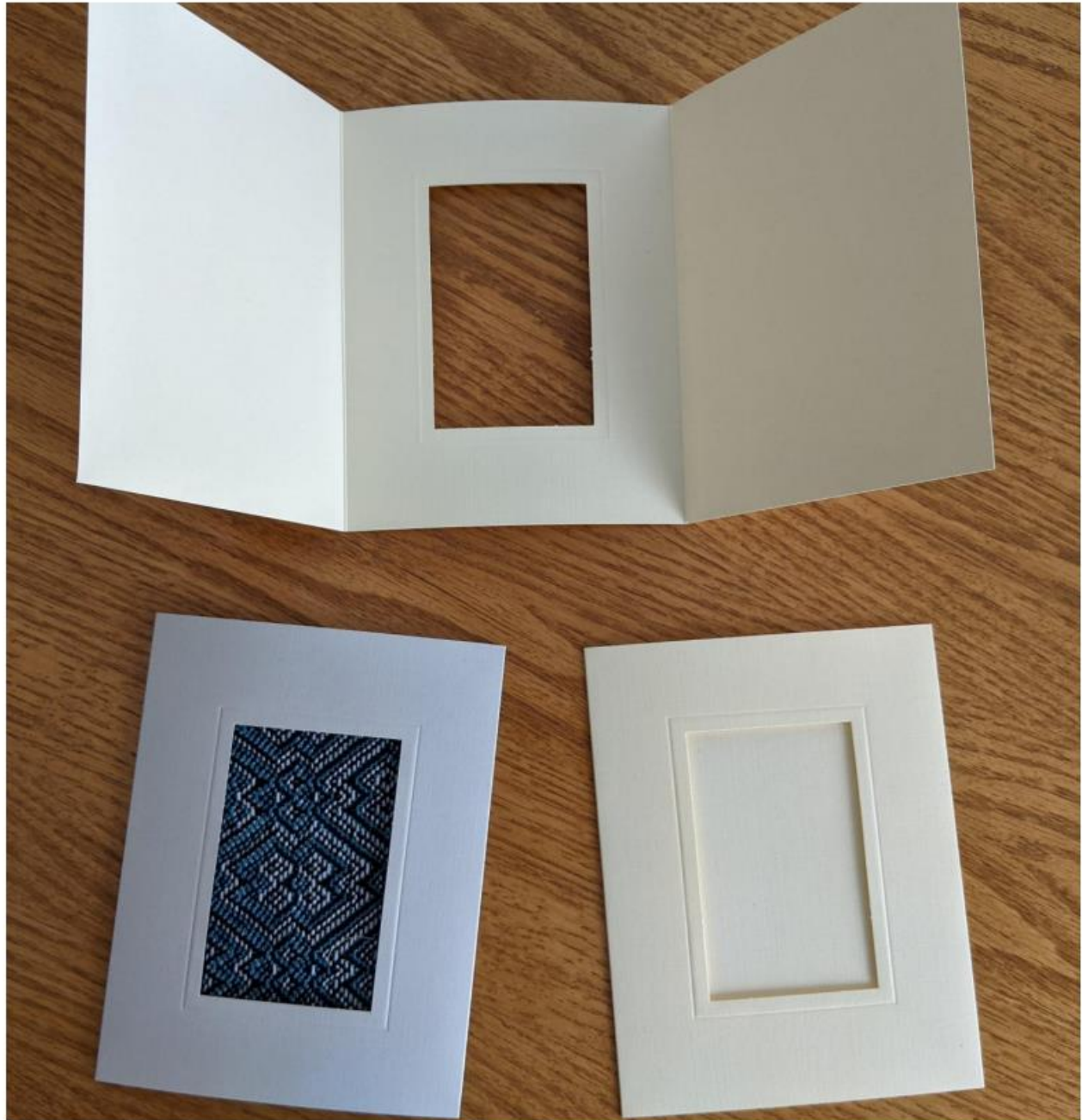
